# Uniform Policy

**This policy is intended to be read by parents and carers of children at Chivenor Primary School. Uniform is compulsory at Chivenor Primary School, as well as other schools across the country; we strongly believe that wearing uniform promotes a sense of belonging, identity and pride. It plays a valuable role in contributing to the ethos of a school.**

## Uniform

- Grey trousers, skirt or pinafore dress
- Navy blue jumper / cardigan **with school logo**
- White shirt
- School tie
- Dark or white socks
- Dark coloured, plain tights (no patterns)
- Black shoes (no boots, open toe or backless shoes)
- Headwear for religious observance (navy blue or white)
- In winter months' boots can be worn to school and pupils change into shoes once at school

## Summer Uniform Variations

- Blue and white checked summer dress
- White polo shirt **with school logo** and grey shorts

## PE

- Navy blue shorts / joggers
- White polo shirt
- Dark pumps or trainers
- One-piece swimming costume
- Swimming trunks – no long legged shorts

**Please ensure all items of clothing have the child's name inside as school cannot take responsibility for any lost item.**

## Jewellery

- A small pair of stud earrings
- A watch
- No rings
- Medical Identity bracelets, e.g. for Diabetes or Epilepsy are permitted

**All items of jewellery should be removed and only covered with a plaster by parents for PE and only if they cannot be removed. If coverage is not secure PE staff have the right to redirect pupil's involvement in the lesson. Children must be able to remove jewellery independently, or they will not be permitted to wear**

### Hair

- Long hair must be tied back for PE lessons. Any hairstyle that could be seen as "extremes of fashion" (mohicans, coloured extensions and patterned hair etc) will not be permitted.

### Equal Opportunities

All children have equal access to wearing school uniform regardless of culture, race, religion, gender or ability.

### Compliance with Uniform Policy

All families are expected to comply with the school policy. The following actions will occur if the policy is not followed.

If a child is not wearing the correct uniform for a genuine reason, please send a note into school with them. This is acceptable in rare circumstances for a short time period (such as a few days). Repeat non-compliance of a child not wearing the correct uniform, a reminder letter will go home (or phone call made) to ask parent / carers to comply with the policy. Following this parents/carers will be asked to attend a meeting with a Senior Leader responsible for your child's year group to establish how issues with uniform can be resolved.

We always seek to work with our parents and carers and will support wherever we can.

**If any parent would like the school to modify the uniform policy, they should make representation, in the first instance, to the Head. Exceptions may be made upon individual request, e.g. religious observance or for children with disabilities.**
