What have our Griffins been learning this week?

Y1 have been busy partitioning tens and ones and working with base ten and part whole models. They have also been counting in 10s and dancing their way through lesson introductions with Jack Hartmann! In English, Y1 have been looking at Spring poems by Shirley Hughes from the book 'Out and About' and writing





sentences with nouns, verbs and adjectives. In Science, our Griffins have created some beautiful artwork of an

iconic spring flower - the daffodil. They learned that the flowers are supported by the stem and that bees collect pollen from the flowers to pass to other daffodils to help make even more plants! They have finished the half term by making hot air balloons using papier mache. Y1 will be adding baskets for a display to complete their 'Planes, Trains and Automobiles' topic.

Y2 have been making pancakes in preparation to write instructions including imperative verbs. In Maths, Y2 have been multiplying and dividing and have had lots of opportunities to work practically in maths! In Science, they have been learning about a famous inventor called Macintosh who created waterproof clothing. Y2 have finished the week by evaluating their Tudor houses and recreating the Great Fire of London! Fire extinguishers at the ready!



Following our Shakespeare day, Year 3 were inspired to learn more about playscripts. They have read, discussed and performed part of the play Oliver Twist. Additionally, Y3 have begun learning about fractions; identifying unit fractions, non-unit fractions and comparing them.

Finally, Y3 are wrapping up their Stone Age topic with a descriptive leaflet about Stonehenge, check ClassDojo to see some pictures of their writing!

Y4 have been learning about fractions in maths: they have learnt what an improper fraction is and how to convert it to a mixed fraction. In science, they have investigated the difference between an insect and an arachnid by identifying their key characteristics. They have sketched their own interpretations of



African masks and gained inspiration from 'The Butterfly Lion' to write a balanced argument using formal language.

All our Griffins took part in Internet Safety Day.

Every child has the right to reliable information from the media. This should be information that children can understand. Governments must help protect children from materials that could harm them.



Mrs Werrett will look at clubs for next term to see what we can offer.

I have waited for the weather to improve but this will be ordered this week. I just hope everyone respects and looks after what we buy.

Wet play games and colouring things – please can we have some? (Millie and Evie)

Again, an order will be done – but this may be for an area outside (quiet area) they can then be used at wet lunches if needed.

Can we have a bigger trampoline and bikes for the track?

Unfortunately not. From a Health and Safety angle, bikes on the playground would not be good. If we had a bigger trampoline, we would lose space. Sorry!

More Communication

We have worked very hard in recent months. Our communication consists of texts, emails, Class Dojo, Facebook, Twitter, our School app, newsletters and website. We will continue to monitor to see if more can be done.

APP events remain on calendar

We have spoken to the company to see if this can be rectified.

Get children to speak up more

Pupil voice is very important to us and an area we work hard at in school. We have our weekly 5-minute chats, Pupil Parliament meetings and they lead assemblies sometimes. We also have the Eco Warriors. Our wellbeing warriors are also on hand. We have a suggestion box and Barnaby's Box for worries. We also do regular surveys with the children. After half term, we will also be starting meetings with our new Learning Council. So there is a lot of pupil voice – maybe we need to share this with parents more.

Rewards for Children to earn – like points to spend.

These are already in place. They started last year. Mrs Werrett will share this information again, so everyone is aware.

Reading Clubs at lunchtime

You may have already noticed our Outdoor Reading Den on KS1 playground. We are also looking at provision on KS2 playground.
