Please note that any messages need to come to school via Class Dojo NOT Facebook Messenger.

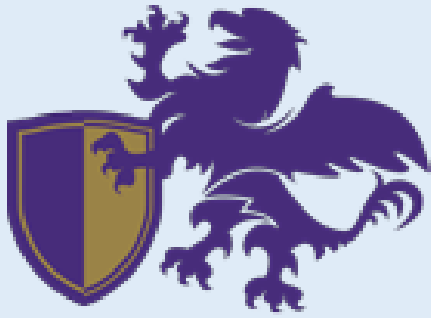

## **What have our Griffins been learning this week?**

\*Reception have been learning about people who help us; we have looked at the roles of the emergency services and what to do if we need their help. Last week we looked at the story 'Supertato' and our Reception Griffins created their own sentences linked to the story about what happened to the vegetables in the book. In maths, we have been looking at 2d and 3d shapes, learning all about the properties and shape names. We played a game of guess the shape for children to link their knowledge to hidden shapes.

Year 1 have created bird feeders and hung them in the forest school garden. All the children enjoyed getting messy with the ingredients. In maths, we have been consolidating all the skills we have learned so far. We also drew hands on the clock to make 'o'clock' times. In English, we have created story maps and recounted the hilarity of 'What the ladybird heard'. We have also been testing our phonics skills ahead of the phonics screening test. Keep going! We want you to all pass with flying colours so keep the reading going over the holidays - a great pastime with an easter egg!!

\*Y2 have continued to explore London and have become tour guides! We have created our own tour booklets with a recount and facts about each Landmark. Y2 have continued our topic of measurement and have been focusing on ml and Litres; we have done some practical activities to help us in our learning. In Science, we have explored the different fruits and vegetables that plants produce. We tasted a range of fruit and veg and decided if they were the root, stem or leaf of a plant. In Creative Curriculum, we created our own moving carriages for King Charles Coronation. We used an axel and wheels to make this possible.

\*This week in Year 3, we have explored how shadows are formed using puppets and torches to help us with our investigation. We discovered that the further away light is from an object, the shadow increases in size. Year 3 also made a stop motion animation about the battle between Boudicca and the Romans; we were very careful about where we placed our characters and where we held a camera for consistency within our pictures.

\*In maths this week, Y4 have been converting fractions into decimals and working on our place value using number lines. In English, we have been writing a narrative inspired by different cultures. In music and drumming this week we invited the parents to come in see their performances. Some performed their lion king scripts while others read their Butterfly Lion Poems.

\*In Y5, we have been looking at the features of rivers focusing on the Colorado River which is responsible for creating the Grand Canyon. We have also looked at the process which sees gold deposits found in the water thus starting the California Gold Rush in the mid 19th Century. In music, we have been learning the chords and melody to the classic carol Silent Night, and in English, our Griffins have published their own stories based on the characters in Skellig. Y5 Curie performed their Shakespeare play 'A comedy of Errors' at Perrywood and in School this week too! In Maths, Y5 have looked at the area and perimeter of rectilinear shapes and composite shapes and in science, they have gathered data on the heights of babies, boys and girls in their first 12 months of life and presented this through the construction of a line graph. In their final swim session, our Y5 Griffins swam as far as they could in one go to allow us to compare their progress over the swimming sessions this term.

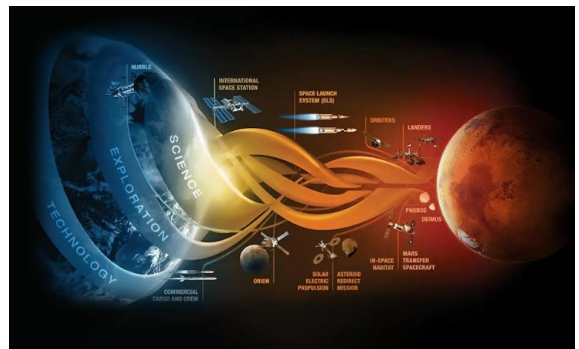


# PROUD TRADITIONS

## Science Symposium

This half term we have celebrated the Griffin Science Symposium. The theme for the GSS this year has been Family or Connections. The Young Griffins have had extra lessons to explore the different connections which can be found in their science topics. Year 6 took part in a seminar with Dr Alice Dunford from the Open University about her work involving space probes. Year 4 were out finding links in the natural environment to explore their hypothesis that more insects than mammals lived around school. Year 5 were concluding their astronaut training with some NASA tasks getting lunar modules to land safely and delivering payloads on target.

Alongside this, the children were also exploring links with the history of the local community; Aviation. Year 5 designed a water powered rocket and implemented their designs and tested them whilst some classes in the lower school were designing and testing paper aeroplanes, using their knowledge of different forces.



## World Book Day

Thank you to all the parents for their great effort for World Book Day. Our Griffins enjoyed lots of activities in the class and even had a workshop with an Author! We had an assembly where our Griffins paraded their costumes to all of their friends and teachers chose the best dressed for each class. 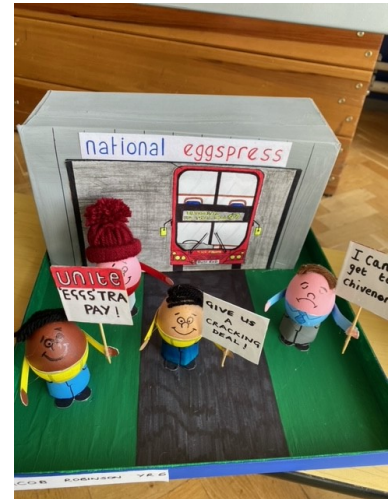

## Y1 Visit to the Safari Park

To support their topic 'Amazing Animals' our Year 1 children visited West Midlands Safari Park to see the animals roaming around the grass, before getting up close with some smaller creatures in a hands-on session. They learnt all about what animals eat and where they live and even got to meet some of the birds of prey.



## Y6 Visit Harry Potter World

Y6 visited Harry Potter World as part of their Topic work. They took part in a costume workshop where they learnt how the costume department distress the clothes for films and had a go themselves!

Our Y6 Griffins were able to tour around the studios, some took a Herbology class, a ride on a broomstick using green-screen technology to make it look like they were soaring through the skies!



## Y4 visit Shakespeare's House

Just before half term, our Year 4 Griffins visited Shakespeare's house in Stratford Upon Avon.

When they arrived, they were split into groups to take part in different activities. Some children learnt part of a play and performed it on a staged area in the garden outside the house where William Shakespeare grew up as a child.

Another group went on a tour of Stratford to find out about where Shakespeare went to school and where he was eventually buried. The last group spent the day as tour guides in Shakespeare's birthplace, telling the public and their friends about life during Shakespearian times. We were

very impressed with all the children's knowledge and we hope they enjoyed this special trip as part of our Shakespeare week celebrations.



## Y3 Roman Visitor

This week, our Year 3 Griffins were visited by a Roman Soldier who showed them some of his replica weapons and artefacts and told them about life during Roman times. The children re-enacted a Roman battle and tried on some of the armour while learning how to say "Hello" and "Goodbye" in Latin. Our Griffins had a fantastic day and we were very impressed by their fabulous costumes.

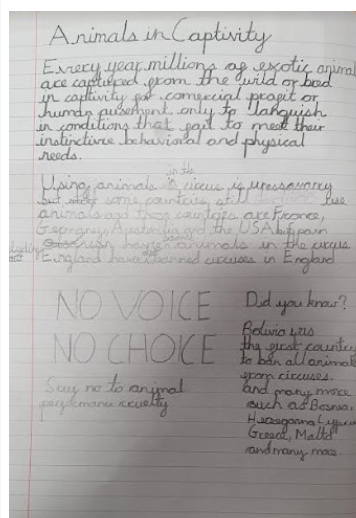
## Pupil Parliament

## **Visit from the Police**

PC Reynolds, PC Walsh and PC Stanley joined Reception and Y1 to speak to them about their job. They showed our Griffins the different parts of their uniform and brought items to try on. PC Reynolds brought along his Police van and our Griffins were able to sit in it and turn on the blue flashing lights and sirens– they were very loud! A number of Griffins and teachers were also put in the cage, in the back of the van, but thankfully none were taken down to the station! Reception have been learning about ‘People who help us’ in their topic work and there were some amazing questions and observations made by both year groups.



PC Reynolds came back to speak with Years 5 and 6 about his career and role in the Police force this week. He was asked some fabulous questions by our Griffins who found out that initially PC Reynolds wanted to join the army, about the kit he wears, some of the work he does currently and about his next adventure when he leaves Castle Vale to move down South in a couple of months. PC Reynolds also spoke about malicious communication with Years 5 and 6 and the implications of misusing social media. PC Reynolds has promised he will return for another visit with our older Griffins before he moves as they have also requested a look in his police van!



## **Celebrating Culture and Diversity**

We are so lucky at Chivenor that our family is made up of a wealth of cultures, traditions and heritages. Over March and April we have a lot to celebrate:

The Islamic calendar follows the phases of the moon, commonly known as the lunar cycle. Easter Sunday is on 9th April 2023 and the week leading up to Easter is called Holy Week, consisting of Palm Sunday (the Sunday before Easter Sunday when Jesus arrived in Jerusalem riding on a donkey), Maundy

Thursday (when Christians remember when Jesus ate the Passover meal with his disciples, breaking bread and drinking wine– also known as the Last Supper) and Good Friday (which commemorates the crucifixion of Jesus).

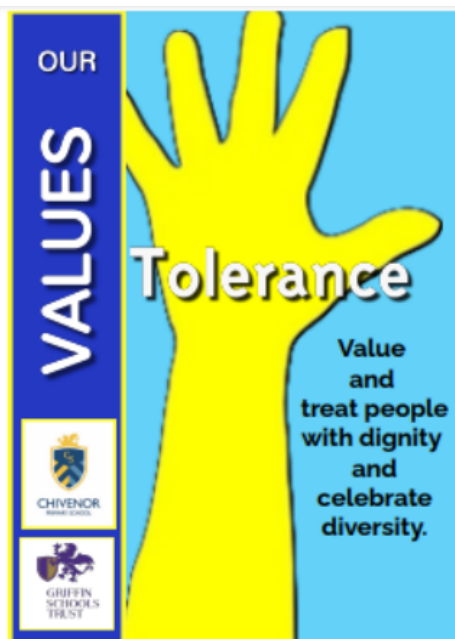
### Article 18 (parental responsibilities and state assistance):

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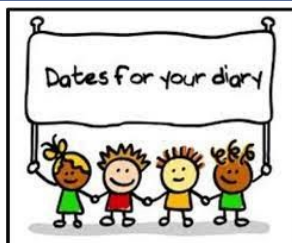
