What have our Griffins been learning this week?

*Reception have been reading the story The Very Hungry Caterpillar. During literacy we used our phonic knowledge to write words and sentences about the story and we compared the caterpillar's length in maths. The children loved talking about the life cycle of the butterfly and creating their own using a variety of different shaped pasta.

*Year 1 have been practising counting up to and beyond 100 and partitioning the 10's and 1's. In English, they have been writing character descriptions and have written a description for others to guess who they are describing. We have had some lovely ideas and shows how much they all care for each other—using words like 'sensible', 'beautiful' and 'kind'. We are going back in time in our topic lessons—looking at seasides of the past and writing a postcard from a Victorian holidaymaker! The Y1 Griffins also made their own sketchbooks to record their ideas and artwork. As Spring turns to Summer, we have been revisiting our 'seasons' theme in Science to show how each season is different. We have also continued to learn about 'The Rights of the Child' and about child labour. They were very sad to hear that some children in other countries have no choice but to go out to work and cannot afford to go to school. Finally this week, we have tried our hand at decoding Morse Code!

*Y2 had a forest school day on Monday. The children made some flags using leaves, scrap material and sticks, went on a leaf hunt and had an ice lolly and a story outside in the sunshine. They thoroughly enjoyed their day! We've also enjoyed making tally charts in Maths, comparing our eye colour and favourite sports. In English we have been writing fabulous recounts and even enjoyed making cakes!

*This week in Year 3, we have been exploring where fruit is grown in the world with a focus on Europe. Then, we learned about food safety and what we can do to make sure we don't contaminate the food we are working with. Fruit crumbles are on the menu and we can't wait to taste them!

*This week year 4 has started to investigate electricity and how to stay safe with common household electrical appliances. In maths we have begun to look at different angles and shapes while learning key vocabulary such as acute, obtuse, parallelograms, rhombus and trapezium. We have also role played being sellers and customers in our English lessons by using persuasive language techniques and focusing on imperative verbs.

*In Y5, we have had an exciting week! Some of us have been to the Symphony Hall to take part in singing playground! Then we've all been to Beaumanor Hall for a World War Two day! In English we've continued the WWII theme and have been looking at the famous speech from Winston Churchill and have been creating our own persuasive speech.

*In Y6, they have been working through maths investigations to help us consolidate children's mathematical understanding. In English and Creative Curriculum, we have been researching and writing a non-chronological report about The Amazon or tropical rainforest. In Science, we have been learning about Charles Darwin's theory of evolution. This week we have started an investigation into the Galapagos finches and will be writing this up as part of our writing assessments. Some of Y6 have also started their visits to Forest School.

Have you seen our new indoor/outdoor classrooms?

Half term on site was extremely exciting as our new pod project began. The first few days

saw the new classroom arrive on site in two sections. Tensions were high as it was lifted into place. Our new pod was designed and made by Podular System Ltd. It is made of 89% recycled aluminium, insulated with recycled plastic bottles and sheepswool and all materials sourced within 50 miles of the factory where it was made. All joining, sealing and plastering is now complete. Wiring to our solar panels will be finished tomorrow and painting is also nearly complete! It is certainly taking shape and there are a number of Griffins— and staff- who are very eager to set foot inside! Decking will be completed next week and then each class will be taken in by Mrs Guest for a lesson focused on sustainability and what this means.



Chivenor is definitely leading the way with sustainability.




Being on time is just as important!


Article 35 (Prevention of sale and trafficking)

Governments must protect children from being abducted, sold or moved illegally to a different place in or outside their country for the purpose of exploitation.




