

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

that you could donate, please send into the office.






#### Uniform

Our Griffins have looked so smart since returning after the summer—well done! Please refer to our school website for more details about our uniform (including jewellery) policy. Look smart, work smart!

Just a reminder: Children are allowed to come into school on PE days wearing



navy jogging bottoms, a white t-shirt and their school jumper/cardigan. Trainers must be plain black- no visible logos. It is an expectation that children wear PE kit for PE sessions. It would help staff and your child if you ensured they did not wear any earrings on their PE days. Please check your childs class dojo for information on PE days.





#### **Importance of sleep**

Like everyone, children need sleep and it's really important they get it (both for them and for you!) Sometimes getting them to sleep is tricky but a predictable routine can help. It's pretty obvious that a child who is getting enough sleep is more likely to be happy and alert than a child who isn't. Getting your child into a good sleeping pattern isn't just about avoiding tantrums though, lack of sleep has been linked to future problems such as anxiety, depression, obesity and high blood pressure.

How much sleep? As a rough guide children need:

3-5 year olds = 11-14 hours of sleep

6-12 year olds—10-13 hours of sleep

Top tip: Turn off screens an hour before bedtime. Audiobooks or good old-fashioned paper books are a good alternative to eBooks. Light from screens stops the production of the sleep hormone melatonin.
